

# **DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW**

The Schaumburg Fire Department provides suppression and emergency medical services to a daytime population of 150,000. Responding from five fire stations, 120 shift personnel responded to 10,736 calls in 2023. Our firefighters work with state-of-the-art apparatus and equipment with a full-time training and logistics staff to support their activities. The department maintains several specialty teams that include technical rescue, water rescue/recovery, hazardous materials, and fire investigations. The Village of Schaumburg Nursing & Senior Services Division is also under the oversight of the fire department. This division provides services to enhance the safety, health, and well-being of the residents in a variety of ways.

The fire department also provides education and prevention activities through:

- Public school and senior citizen programs
- Fire explorer scout and citizen fire academy programs
- CPR instruction
- Smoke alarm programs
- Cable television presentations
- Festivals and community gatherings
- Fire inspections commercial & residential



# **KEY ACTIVITIES**

The Schaumburg Fire Department responded to 940 incidents in October 2024. Emergency medical service requests accounted for 609 or 65% of the monthly total. The remaining 331 or 35% of the incidents were fire/rescue related requests.

There was one structure fire for the month of October 2024 to report.





Fire / Rescue Activity


Average Response Time Dispatched to On Scene Time








## EMS Activity for October 2023 and 2024

# **COMMUNITY RISK REDUCTION**

The Community Risk Reduction division provides a holistic approach to fire prevention and safety. The purpose of the division is to reduce the risk of fire and all hazards through various methods, including public education and inspections.

## Public Education

- Public Education Officer provided evacuation and safety training at 1124 Tower Rd, 1700 E Golf Rd, 1900 E Golf Rd, 1827 Walden Office Sq, 1299 Zurich Way, and 1400-1450 American Ln for approximately 225 people.
- Fire department staff provided fire extinguisher training for employees of the Schaumburg Library, Bisco, and Encore Village.
- Public Education Officer provided preschool lessons at Big Barn Preschool, Bright Horizons, Guidepost Montessori, and Kidde Academy for approximately 140 children.
- Public Education Officer presented on fire safety at the home at The Barn for approximately 30 older adults.
- Public Education Officer provided first aid training for 9 Girl Scouts.
- Public Education Officer provided fire safety lessons at Campanelli, Hoover, Dirksen, and Blackwell schools for approximately 300 students.
- Fire department personnel witnessed fire drills at 1700 E Golf Rd, 1900 E Golf Rd, 1475-1515 Woodfield Rd, 425-475 Martingale Rd, 1299 Zurich Way, and 1821-1834 Walden Office Sq.
- Fire department personnel conducted five home safety visits.

# NURSING AND SENIOR SERVICES DIVISION

The division is committed to the needs of the residents and employees of Schaumburg. A variety of services are offered to promote the physical and emotional well-being of these groups. This division also serves in an advisory capacity for the Board of Health, Committee on Aging, Blood Program Committee, Public Health Advisory Committee, and the Schaumburg Healthy U initiative. Additionally, the Nursing & Senior Services Supervisor serves as the coordinator for the Village of Schaumburg Medical Reserve Corps.

## Nursing Program

Visiting nurse services are available to homebound residents who do not qualify for other homecare services. Our nurses visit residents in their home and monitor their care under the guidance of their physician to provide assistance with activities of daily living. In addition, our registered nurses are available to meet with residents and employees to address any health concerns, provide education, review medications, and provide navigation to community resources. Our durable medical equipment lending program is robust and an essentially free service, utilizing a cash security deposit and return system.

## **Key Activities:**

During October, the Nursing & Senior Services division and the Medical Reserve Corps each staffed information tables at the Public Safety Open House. A grant was obtained from the Illinois EPA to provide funds for empty sharps container distribution to residents and to provide for pickup of the needle waste collected. We also staffed the last of the Farmer's Markets this month and held a blood drive collecting --- donations which will impact 57 lives. We were also a stop on the Schaumburg Township's Historical Society's Barn Tour, where interested folks were able to tour the Barn and hear about current use of the building.

## Senior Services Program:


Located at the Barn, for a small donation, a well-balanced and nutritious weekday lunch program is funded by the Community Nutrition Network and provided to Schaumburg Township residents who are age 60 and over and/or disabled. We also partner with the Greater Chicago Food Depository to offer Older Adult Market Days on alternating Fridays, providing free fresh produce and shelf-stable items. Various education and social activities are also offered.

## **Key Activities:**

Beginning Monday, Oct. 21, patrons of the Schaumburg Barn were be able to register for meals and activities online via <u>www.myactivecenter.com</u>. My Active Center is the new electronic registration system that was obtained by the Village of Schaumburg to make the registration process more efficient for Barn members. For those without access to a computer, we will have online registration available at The Barn. Each registered member will receive an individual key tag that they will use to register for monthly activities and daily check- ins. As of Oct. 31, we have registered 423 senior clients.
