90 NORTH ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT MOVING FORWARD

At its June 25 Village Board meeting, Schaumburg officials approved a bid for work to begin on the 90 North Entertainment Parking Garage. The 900-space parking garage, which will feature a pedestrian bridge into the Renaissance Hotel, will serve tenants of future developments in that location, including Andretti Indoor Karting and Games and two other users. The garage will be located west of the Renaissance Hotel and Convention Center and will also provide additional parking for the hotel's guests and visitors. Construction is anticipated to start this fall.

Andretti Indoor Karting and Games will serve as the entertainment anchor of Phase 1 and is currently going through the permit review process with an anticipated open date in 2026. Village staff are searching for additional entertainment and restaurant users that will be reviewed for appropriate placement in the Entertainment District. HEADING TO SEPTEMBERFEST?



Please note some changes related to traffic operations to ensure a safe festival for all participants, staff and the adjacent neighborhoods.

- Summit Drive will be restricted to one-way only traffic heading northbound from Stock Port Lane to Schaumburg Road.
- Vehicular access on Summit Drive between Stock Port Lane and Schaumburg Road will be restricted to vehicles with Septemberfest parking passes only.

- Persons with disabilities who have a valid state-issued placard/plate will be allowed through the restricted area to use accessible parking spaces along Summit Drive between Stock Port Lane and Schaumburg Road.
- Parking will not be permitted on the north side of Stock Port Lane between Summit Drive and Carmelhead Lane.
- The public is encouraged to use free park and ride shuttles and/or rideshare services.

On Monday, Sept. 2 for the Parade

- Summit Drive will be closed from Wise Road to Beech Drive beginning at 8 a.m. The road will be reopened to northbound traffic only at the completion of the parade once deemed safe.
- No parking on either side of Beech Drive from Summit Drive to Roselle Road to allow for disembarking of parade participants.

Public Input Needed for Industrial Park TIF District

The Schaumburg Village Board recently approved a new TIF District for one of its industrial parks. The overall goal of this redevelopment project is to reduce or eliminate conditions that qualify as “conservation areas” for improved parcels, “blighted areas” for unimproved parcels, and to provide the direction and mechanisms necessary to redevelop the industrial park as a vibrant industrial and commercial district. This includes revitalizing the 573-acre industrial park through infrastructure and property improvements, strengthening the area’s economic and employment base, and enhancing overall quality of life within the project area.

The Village of Schaumburg wants to hear from building owners, businesses, and residents as to what they would like to see accomplished within the industrial park. The input you provide will be used to identify program opportunities, challenges, and common themes across the industrial park. Questions will pertain to the look of the industrial park, the vision for the park and its businesses, and which infrastructure improvements are critical for the overall success of the industrial park. Health Services Needs Assessment Update

In 2024, the Village of Schaumburg took a significant step toward enhancing the health and well-being of its residents by finalizing Phase I of a comprehensive Health Services Needs Assessment (HSNA). This initiative has been conducted to better understand health needs of residents and to evaluate existing services in Schaumburg. To ensure a thorough assessment, the village adopted the nationally recognized Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) model, developed by the National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO). Endorsed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, MAPP is considered a gold standard for community health needs assessments and is equivalent to the Illinois Department of Public

Future New Police Station Site

Schaumburg village officials recently approved the purchase of the property at 1000 Woodfield Road to serve as the site of the future police station.

The village continues to work with Williams Architects on the design of a new village hall and police station. The Atcher Municipal Center, which was built in 1971, and the Public Safety Building, which was built in 1975, were both scored as “Replacement Indicated” in a 2021 conditions assessment.

The 1000 Woodfield Road property will serve as a temporary village hall beginning in 2025 while the demolition and construction of a new building occurs at 101 Schaumburg Court. Once the new village hall is constructed, the building at 1000 Woodfield Road will be demolished and a new police station will be built. For more

Police Department Takes First in 2023 Traffic Safety Challenge



The Schaumburg Police Department is pleased to announce it has received first place in the 2023 Traffic Safety Challenge.

The Illinois Traffic Safety Challenge (ITSC) is an innovative traffic safety awards program that targets four major traffic safety priorities: Occupant Protection, Speeding, Distracted Driving, and Impaired Driving. The ITSC recognizes the best overall traffic safety programs in the state and provides agencies with an opportunity to make a significant difference in the communities they serve. Below are some enforcement highlights that helped the department receive this distinction in 2023:

- Issued approximately 3,187 speed-related citations and written warnings
- Issued 703 seatbelt and 42 child safety seat citations/warnings
- Issued approximately 2,700 distracted/negligent citations and written warnings
- Issued approximately 375 DUI-related citations

In addition to analyzing a variety of data related to traffic and the tools used to enforce motorists adherence to local laws, the police department also was recognized for its ongoing efforts to promote safety with its holiday traffic safety campaigns, its variety of outreach efforts in the community, and participation in other initiatives geared toward motorist, bicycle, and pedestrian safety.

LIVE FIRE TRAINING PERFORMED AT BURN TOWER

Schaumburg firefighters visited the Carol Stream Fire Protection District to use its burn tower for live fire training. While live fire training is afforded to personnel at the Elk Grove Village training tower, this training was considered Class A, which means combustibles such as wood products were used to create a more realistic fire experience. As a result, participants were able to train in realistic heat and smoke conditions to experience how fire behaves when water and ventilation were introduced. The Schaumburg Fire Department thanks the Carol Stream Fire Protection District for providing this opportunity to enhance personnel training so that members can be prepared for emergencies when called upon. Home Safety Visits

The Schaumburg Fire Department responds to many types of emergencies with more than 10,000 calls for service performed annually. Many calls request an ambulance for a medical emergency, some of which are for individuals who have fallen. Falls can often be prevented and may occur due to area rugs that are worn and items that block paths within the home. The best way to find and correct some of these issues is to have a Home Safety Visit performed by the Schaumburg Fire Department. Firefighters will come in and look for things that might cause a fall or pose a safety issue, like that loose rug or outdated Carbon Monoxide detector. Firefighters will make recommendations and install a new smoke detector if needed after testing it during the visit. A Home Safety Visit is just one way the Schaumburg Fire Department helps to keep the

Crossroads Development Approved

The Village Board approved a new multi-tenant shopping center called Crossroads of Schaumburg that will feature a variety of new retail and restaurant uses located at the northwest corner of Meacham and Golf roads.

Proposed tenants for the space include restaurants such as Lazy Dog, Piccolo Buco, Cava, Velvet Taco, Crisp & Green, Panda Express, and Naansense.

The shopping center will be constructed on the vacant area previously occupied by the former Macy's furniture store. The store was demolished in August 2023.

The newly constructed buildings will have iconic designs to reflect the importance of the location and the project. The project will also include site improvements, such as crosswalks and sidewalks, patios that will provide outdoor dining opportunities for restaurants, and professionally designed landscaping. Through this redevelopment of the area, the project aims to contribute positively to the economic vitality, aesthetic appeal, and overall community experience at this significant location within Schaumburg. CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

90 North Shared Street Construction Progress

Construction of the Shared Street located along the west side of the 90 North District Park from Progress Parkway to Landmark Avenue began earlier this spring. Work has continued on the project with rough grading of the new road completed recently. The water main installation is about 90 percent complete with the storm sewer about 95 percent complete. Electrical system installations began in June and are about 75 percent complete. Concrete work began at the end of July.

National Parkway Reconstruction

Work has continued on the reconstruction of National Parkway. The new roundabout has been added and the majority of sidewalk has been paved. Roadway paving and striping work has commenced and will continue for the near future. The bike path has been paved along the west side of National Parkway and all of the new roadway lighting has been installed. The irrigation contractor continues to install the water system for the landscaped medians and topsoil has been spread along the parkways. The road is expected to open in early fall. Rodenburg Road Reconstruction

Reconstruction of Rodenburg Road between Irving Park Road and Central Avenue in Roselle began earlier this spring. Work continued through the summer. Crews installed the new medians at the railroad crossing, finished installation of the curb and gutters, and provided the new asphalt paving. Work was completed to restore the "Quiet Crossing" for train traffic, which means passing trains will not need to sound their horns unless there is an obstruction on the tracks or a commuter train is stopped at the Schaumburg Metra station. The roadway remains closed to vehicles and pedestrians. The project includes resurfacing and patching between Timberleaf Circle South and Central Avenue, which will begin in August. Crews will also be installing a new pedestrian path and working on landscaping and roadway lighting before the road is reopened. The project is expected to be complete by the end of 2024. The village congratulates its Bike Month winners who were recently recognized for their participation in several challenges that took place in June. The village held the 6th Annual Business Bike Classic where 12 teams with 48 individuals biked a cumulative 12,729 miles for the month. Winners of this classic included teams Z Cycle De Lego of Zurich (3,194 miles), IDOT iBike Team 2 of IDOT (1,992 miles), and One More Mile of Zurich (1,783 miles).

The inaugural Family & Friends Bike Classic had three teams compete with 12 individuals who biked a cumulative 3,934 miles in June. The first-place winner was the Schaumburg Bicycle Club team with 2,119 miles.

The village also held its popular community Fahrrad Tour von Schaumburg Bike Ride in which hundreds participated in this family favorite biking activity through Schaumburg. Biking in Schaumburg

Get outdoors and enjoy some of Schaumburg's many bike routes. As a bicycle-friendly community with more than 90 miles of bike paths, bike lanes, and bike routes, Schaumburg provides residents with a variety of opportunities to explore area neighborhoods and its amenities.

Have you tried one of the suggested bike routes?

Town Square to Heritage Farm & Spring Valley - A 4.2-mile loop that links Town Square, Village Hall, Prairie Center for the Arts, Sculpture Park, Heritage Farm, Spring Valley Nature Center, Lancer Creek Bike Path, Meineke Community Center, and Abrahamsen Park.

Town Square to Woodfield & Busse Woods/Ned Brown Forest Preserve - The Woodfield area and Busse Woods are only 3.5 miles away from Town Square. Busse Woods features 10.8 miles of bike path and the Woodfield area features shopping, restaurants and entertainment.

Town Square to Poplar Creek Forest Preserve - Poplar Creek Forest Preserve is only a 6.2-mile bike ride from Town Square (the last 1/4 mile is in Hoffman Estates). Poplar Creek features 10.4 miles of bike trails.

Town Square - Town Square is easily accessible by bike! Visit the Schaumburg Public Library, Bonefish Grill, Walker Bros. Pancake House, Trickster Cultural Center, Menchies, and Oberweis.

Town Square to Paul Douglas Forest Preserve - The village recently completed a bike bridge over Central Road and I-90 to create a bike connection to Paul Douglas Forest Preserve. This Forest Preserve features a 7.2-mile bike trail that circles the park.

Annual Comprehensive Financial Report Award

The Village of Schaumburg's Finance Department was recognized at the June 25 Village Board meeting for receiving the Government Finance Officers Association Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the FY22/23 annual comprehensive financial report.

The certificate is the highest form of recognition for excellence in state and local government financial reporting. An impartial panel evaluated the report and determined that it meets the program's high standards and effectively demonstrates a "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story.

Each year, the Finance Department spends many hours incorporating new Governmental Accounting Standards Board pronouncements, preparing workpapers, meeting with stakeholders, and responding to auditor requests. This is the 39th time the village has received this recognition.

ICMA Recognizes Schaumburg with Community Health & Safety Award



The International City/County Management Association (ICMA) recently recognized the Village of Schaumburg with the Community Health & Safety Award for its innovation and excellence in implementing its Crisis Response and Intervention Program.

During 2022, Schaumburg experienced a 46% increase in police interactions with individuals having suicidal ideations or other mental health crises. With thousands of calls for service involving individuals in crisis, the village recognized the need to address these challenges and implemented the Crisis Response and Intervention Program to improve safety, health, wellness, and to enhance the quality of life throughout the community.

The program involved reallocating existing personnel, leveraging technology already in place, and updating operational protocols and procedures, with no new costs incurred. The Schaumburg Police Department created a new Quality of Life Division to enhance proactive problem-solving and collaboration by providing counseling, therapy, and ongoing support to individuals, families, and groups dealing with various social, emotional, and psychological challenges. The police department also ensured its eligible officers became certified in the 40-hour Crisis Intervention



Team (CIT) training course, a comprehensive program designed to equip law enforcement officers with the skills and knowledge necessary to effectively respond to individuals experiencing mental health crises.

As a result of these changes, police social workers are providing additional crisis intervention services, which is reducing the amount and frequency of overall police calls to various residential locations. The program is also reducing the possibility for the need for "use-of-force" on calls for emotionally disturbed individuals, and is assisting individuals to receive the proper care they need, ensuring a safer outcome for both officers and community members. Fall Cost Share Reforestation Program

The village is continuing to replace ash trees through the Cost Share reforestation planting program. The village is offering a Cost Share option to any resident who wishes to have their tree planted sooner than what is otherwise scheduled. To take advantage of this program, participants should create a Customer Service Request or dial 311 in Schaumburg to request participation in the Fall 2024 program. The resident shall pay a percentage of the replacement cost for an approximately 2-inch diameter tree.

Participants will receive a letter requesting their first and second selections when ordering trees to increase the chances that a tree of their choice will be available. Payment for the Cost Share Program can be made online through WebPay at www.schaumburg.com/webpay or in person at the Finance counter inside the Robert O. Atcher Municipal Center, 101 Schaumburg Ct. Free Nursing Services Available

The Village of Schaumburg has a Nursing Division dedicated to providing a variety of nursing services and community programs to help keep Schaumburg healthy and well.

Medical Equipment Loan Closet – In temporary need of medical equipment? The Village of Schaumburg lends medical equipment to Schaumburg Township residents for up to 90 days with a refundable cash security deposit. Medical equipment loans are made by appointment by calling (847) 923-3766.

Medication Disposal – Safely dispose of expired and unused medication in the RxBOX available 24/7 in the lobby of the Police Department, 1000 W. Schaumburg Rd.

Memory Screenings – Free, confidential memory screenings are administered by the village's registered nurses and are available to both Schaumburg residents and non-residents. The face-to-face, non-invasive screening takes about 30-40 minutes and consists of a series of questions and tasks. To register for a screening, call the Schaumburg Nursing Division at (847) 923-3766.

Syringe and Needle Disposal – Residents can bring used sharps, syringes and pen needles that have been placed in a red approved syringe disposal box to the Nursing & Senior Services building during regular business hours.

SCHAUMBURG CHORAL ARTISTS PERFORM OVERSEAS

The Village of Schaumburg enriches its cultural community through a variety of artistic opportunities for area performers, among them the Schaumburg Dance Ensemble, Youth Orchestra, Summer Theatre, and Choral Program – all presented at the beautiful Al Larson Prairie Center for the Arts.

One ensemble of the Choral Program, the Schaumburg Choral Artists, formed in 2022 to provide an outlet for singers with advanced academic choral training. With rapid growth and increasing attention from the Chicago area choral community, the choir felt the time was right to take its show on the road, or, in this case, overseas to Ireland and Scotland.

The whirlwind weeklong tour took the ensemble to three iconic venues: St. Giles Cathedral in Edinburgh, Kelvingrove Galley and Museum in Glasgow, and St. Patrick's Cathedral in Dublin. A vacationing Schaumburg Mayor Dailly was able to catch the ensembles perform in Scotland, while family members and friends accompanied the choir throughout the tour, enjoying the sights and adding to concert audiences that exceeded 300 people at each event.

For Director Tim Koll, choir teacher at Conant High School, the tour signifies more than an exciting trip to Europe to perform – it's a milestone that many ensembles don't embark on until years of operation, if ever. "Tours like this cement our position as a model organization in the field, one with ambitions to grow and seek new opportunities." As for how it all happened so fast, Koll adds "I can't think of a more nurturing environment than the one Schaumburg has fostered, one that supports our mission to perform this music and to inspire others to reach similar heights in whatever they do."
